Overview: Introduction to Islam

Islam is the second largest religion in the world after Christianity. It started in the city of Mecca and was founded by the prophet Muhammad who lived from 570–632CE. It is a monotheistic religion with its roots in Judaism. In this sense it has similar origins to Christianity. Muslims start counting the years of the Muslim era from the Hijra in 622CE. This was when Muhammad left the city of Mecca to be welcomed in the city of Medina. In time, Muhammad returned to Mecca triumphant. This was to be the holy city of Islam. It is the location of the Kaaba (cube) which contains a sacred black stone. It is found in the Great Mosque at Mecca. Muslims from all over the world pray in this same direction five times a day.
