



As well as literacy, numeracy and digital skills, there are **six areas of learning and experienc**e. Everything your child learns will be






The curriculum also covers:

What Matters

Your learning should focus on things that matter for you now and that will matter to you when you're an adult.



An example of how this works

In the Science and Technology area of learning and experience, one of the statements of what matters is:

'The world around us is full of living things which depend on each other for survival.'

As your child learns, they'll think about this in different ways, like this:


- I know that there are endangered animals.

Getting ready

The new curriculum starts from **September 2022** and will be used for all secondary school pupils by the **2026/27** academic year





Progression

The CfW helps teachers develop a more integrated approach to learning. The six Areas bring together familiar disciplines and encourage strong and meaningful links across them.

Our curriculum has been designed to build on the **strong foundations from primary school**, and ensure all students have a rich learning experiences that allows them to make strong progress.

















Within AoLEs and subjects

- ✓ Teacher moving around the classroom checking on progress within the lesson
- Using questioning techniques in the lesson
- ✓ Using **low-stakes tests**/ hinge questions/Multiple Choice Questions
- ✓ Written feedback from teachers every half-term on an assessment focussing on what went well, and the next steps in learning
- ✓ Verbal feedback from teachers focussing on next steps in learning
- ✓ Progress check reports to parents, full report and Parents' Evening

Whole school assessments will include NNRTs, Accelerated Reader, Pupil Attitude to School Surveys(PASS) and GL Assessments.

CfW Transition 2022



- 16 schools visited and the wellbeing and academic needs of each learner discussed with current teaching and support staff
- An understanding of student progress in Literacy, numeracy, science and Welsh captured
- Enhanced Transition packages agreed and shaped over time
- Learner voice activities and learner product scrutiny completed and shared with Croesyceiliog school staff to allow for progression
- Common Year 6 pedagogy and topics identified and shared with Croesyceiliog School staff





- Trial of 'learning leaders' morning with Maendy Primary
- 7 Parent engagement events held leading to discussion about progress and reporting preferences
- Attendance information shared and external agency work commenced to support continued improvement
- Cluster transition plan completed for consultation in July 2022






- All learners interviewed explained that they believe the four purposes to represent characteristics or aspects of a successful learner
- The learners interviewed could identify the differences between knowledge, skills and experience and how all three help them to understand concepts
- In all primary schools visited, students are using success criteria to structure their learning and to assess their own progress
- The self-evaluation aspect of learner progress is extremely detailed in Year 6
- Students are very familiar with the 'language' of CfW.
